PSYC Major Requirements – Typical First-Year Schedule	
Fall: SCSM 101, Springfield College Seminar (Core requirement – 3 cr) ENGL 113, College Writing I (Core requirement – 3 cr) PSYC 101, Introduction to Psychology (3 cr) Plus other Core and major requirements, or electives to total approximately 15 credits	Spring: ENGL 114, College Writing II (Core requirement – 3 cr) A 100- or 200-level PSYC selective Plus other Core and major requirements, or electives to total 30 credits for the year
Fall or Spring: Quantitative Reasoning Core Curriculum course (3cr, prerequisite for PSYC211)	
PSYC Major Requirements – Typical Second-Year Schedule	
Fall or Spring: PSYC 211, Introduction to Statistics (3 cr) PSYC 282, Sophomore Seminar in Psychology (3 cr) Plus Core and major requirements, or electives to total 30 credits for the year	
PSYC Major Requirements – Typical Third-Year Schedule	
Fall or Spring: PSYC 301, Research Methods (3 cr – also fills one WAC requirement) PSYC 302, Research Methods Lab (1 cr) Plus Core and major requirements, or electives to total 30 credits for the year	

PSYC Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

PSYC 482, Senior Capstone Seminar (3 cr)

Plus any outstanding major requirements, Core, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

Additional PSYC Major Requirements - Flexible Timing

In general, 100-level courses should be taken first or second year; 200-level courses should be taken second year or later; 300-and 400-level should be taken third year or later.

Select four courses (12 cr) of the following foundational psychology courses:

- PSYC 109, Human Development (3 cr)
- PSYC 135, Personality and Personal Adjustment (3 cr)
- PSYC 209, Social Psychology (3 cr)
- PSYC 221, Abnormal Psychology (3 cr)
- PSYC 308, Cognitive Psychology (3 cr)

Select one course (3 cr) of the following advanced psychology courses:

- PSYC 340, Child Development (3 cr also fills one WAC requirement)
- PSYC 345, Adolescent and Young Adult Development (3 cr)
- PSYC 401, Motivation and Learning (3 cr)
- PSYC 405, Physiological Psychology (3 cr)
- PSYC 406, Psychology of Diversity (3 cr)

Select one course (3 cr) of the following applied psychology courses:

- PSYC 240, Psychology of Sexual Behavior (3 cr)
- PSYC 320, Health Psychology (3 cr)
- PSYC 330, Human Relations in Organizations (3 cr also fills one WAC requirement)
- PSYC 368, Forensic Psychology (3 cr)
- PSYC 413, Psychological Testing (3 cr)
- PSYC 422, Interviewing and Counseling (3 cr)

Select 4 credits of the following psychology in the larger world courses:

- PSYC 220, Current Issues in Psychology (1 cr, may be repeated under different topics for a total of 2 credits)
- PSYC 386, Internship and Seminar (2 10 cr may count toward major)
- PSYC 480, Directed Research in Psychology (with permission of the instructor, 2-10 cr may count toward major)
