If you entered Springfield College in 2021-2022, use this guide for sequencing your courses. Requirements are subject to change and may not be offered when listed. Use your online degree audit to verify your progress, and always confirm your plans with your advisor.

Core Curriculum Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements

In addition to the major requirements listed below, you will need to fill the following Core Curriculum categories:

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This major typically requires 54 credits to complete. In addition to the Core Curriculum and major requirements listed, you must complete:

- **29 elective credits or more** to total at least 120 credits
- The **residency requirement**—45 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)

ARTD Major Requirements – Typical First-Year Schedule

Fall:

SCSM 101, Springfield College Seminar (Core requirement – 3 cr)
 ENGL 113, College Writing I (Core requirement – 3 cr)
 ARTS 103, Studio in Computer Graphics (3 cr)
 ARTS 108, Studio in Drawing (3 cr – also fills Aesthetic Expression Core Curriculum)
 ARTS 111, Studio in Design (3 cr)
 Plus other Core and major requirements, or electives to total approximately 15 credits

Spring:

ENGL 114, College Writing II (Core requirement – 3 cr)
 ARTS 118, Introduction to Community Arts (3 cr)
 Plus other Core and major requirements, or electives to total approximately 30 credits for the year

ARTD Major Requirements – Typical Second-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

ARTS 190, Community Service Experience (2 cr)
 You should take Core and major requirements, or electives to total 30 credits for the year.

ARTD Major Requirements – Typical Third-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your third year. You should take Core and major requirements, or electives to total 30 credits for the year.

ARTD Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

ARTS 386, Supervised Field Experiences (1-9 cr expect for Art Ed students)
 ARTS 470, Advanced Studio (3 cr)

You should take Core and major requirements, or electives to total 120 credits.

Additional ARTD Major Requirements – Flexible Timing

Select **two courses** (6 credits) from the following courses:

- ARTS 102, Arts and Ideas (3 cr)
- ARTS 104, Creativity: Methods and Practices (3 cr)
- ARTS 120, Contemporary Art (3 cr)

Select **one course** (3 credits) from the following courses:

- ARTS 211, Studio in Sculpture (3 cr)
- ARTS 223, Studio in Ceramics (3 cr)
- ARTS 228, Three-Dimensional Design (3 cr)
- ARTS 231, 3-D Animation (3 cr)

Select **one course** (3 credits) from the following courses:

- ARTS 217, Arts of the Prehistory to the Renaissance (3 cr – also fills half of WAC Core)
- ARTS 218, Renaissance to Modern Art (3 cr)
- ARTS 219, American Art 1700-1900 (3 cr)
- ARTS 221, Women Artists in History (3 cr)
- ARTS 222, Asian Arts and Culture (3 cr)
- ARTS 245, Contemporary Jewish Art (3 cr)

- ARTS 231, 3-D Animation (3 cr)
- ARTS 233, 3-D Video Game Design (3 cr)
- ARTS 260, Advanced Digital, Web & Multimedia Design (2-6 cr)
- ARTS 320, Advanced Web Design (3 cr)
- CISC 120, Introduction to Programming using Mobile Technology (3 cr)
