



Springfield College Sequencing Guide Art Major (non-teaching) ▼ 2017-2018

If you are an Art major (non-teaching) who matriculated to Springfield College in 2017-2018, use this as a guide for sequencing your courses. Requirements listed on this guide are subject to change and may not be offered when listed—use your online degree audit for the most accurate information. Always confirm your plans with your advisor, and consult your advisor or chairperson if you have any questions.

ARTS Major – Typical First-Year Schedule

Fall:

ENGL 113, College Writing I (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd)
ARTS 108, Studio in Drawing (3 cr – also fills Visual/Performing Arts GenEd)
ARTS 111, Studio in Design (3 cr)
Plus GenEds, major requirements with flexible timing, or electives (as applicable) to total approximately 15 credits

Spring:

ENGL 114, College Writing II (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd)
ARTS 116, Studio in Painting (3 cr)
ARTS 210, Figure Drawing (3 cr)
Plus other GenEds, major requirements with flexible timing, or electives (as applicable) to total 30 credits for the year

Fall or Spring:

HLTH 100, Wellness: A Way of Life (3 cr – fills Health and Wellness GenEd)

ARTS Major – Typical Second-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your second year. You should select GenEds, major requirements with flexible timing, or electives (as applicable) to total 30 credits for the year

ARTS Major – Typical Third-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your third year. You should select GenEds, major requirements with flexible timing, or electives (as applicable) to total 30 credits for the year

ARTS Major – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your fourth year. You should select any outstanding major requirements, GenEds, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

ARTS Program Standards

Program standards for the ARTS major include, but are not limited to:

- Have earned a 2.500 GPA or higher in all program requirements
- Have earned a cumulative GPA of 2.500 or higher
- Have earned a C or better in all courses with an ARTS or ATPY prefix

GenEd Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements

This major typically requires 53 or 54 credits to complete. In addition to the requirements previously listed, you must complete:

- **Additional GenEds:** Computing/Technology, Literary Studies, Spiritual/Ethical Dimensions, Quantitative Reasoning, Natural Sciences, Historical/Cultural Studies, Behavioral/Social Sciences, International/Multicultural Studies, Social Justice, and Physical Activity
- **23 elective credits or more** (depending on GenEds and selectives chosen) to total at least 120 credits
- The **residency requirement**—60 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)
