Springfield College Occupational Therapy Department Entry-Level Master of Science Degree Program Application Information

The entry-level master's degree program is for applicants who wish to become occupational therapists and who have, or will have by program entry, baccalaureate degrees in other majors. Applications must be completed online through OTCAS at https://portal.otcas.org/ by January 1 for admission the following fall.

Our review of applications takes into account the following factors:

• Academic qualifications:

- o Cumulative grade point average (CGPA) minimum of 3.00
 - Even if you are still completing your degree and/or prerequisite courses when you apply, you must enter grade information and submit transcripts to OTCAS for any work you have completed so far, and then update that information to verify courses completed after submitting the application.
- o Grades of at least 2.7 in each prerequisite course, with a minimum grade point average of 3.00 across and within each of the four prerequisite areas
 - The attached worksheet is provided to help you identify your prerequisite status and prepare for entering information into the OTCAS online application. Worksheets are not to be submitted as part of the application.
 - While you may apply while still completing some prerequisite courses, the minimum number of courses within each category that must be completed at the point of application is indicated on the worksheet.

• Related experience:

The OTCAS provides space for you to list employment experience as well as volunteer, service, and internship experiences. We do not specify a minimum number of observation hours, but we do consider both depth and breadth of experience in OT and in related areas. Successful applicants must have observed OT services in at least two, preferably three or more, different service delivery settings.

• References:

- Taken together, the references should address your strengths and weaknesses in the areas of
 intellectual or academic skills, creativity, problem-solving skills, and interpersonal qualities.
 References from an employer, from someone who has known you in an academic setting,
 and from an OT are strongly recommended.
- o OTCAS requires that you submit three, but you may submit up to five electronic references.

• Personal statement

You may wish to include within this statement such issues as how your personal and professional experiences and exposure to OT have shaped your decision to enter the profession, the personal qualities you will bring to the profession, and how your own values and beliefs compare with those of the profession.

• Interview

O Springfield College does not require a personal interview. You are encouraged to visit the college and the OT Department to see how well the program meets your needs.
