



Springfield College Sequencing Guide History Major ▼ 2017-2018

If you are a History major (non-teaching) who matriculated to Springfield College in 2017-2018, use this as a guide for sequencing your courses. Requirements listed on this guide are subject to change and may not be offered when listed—use your online degree audit for the most accurate information. Always confirm your plans with your advisor, and consult your advisor or chairperson if you have any questions.

HIST Major – Typical First-Year Schedule

Fall:

ENGL 113, College Writing I (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd)
HIST 101, Survey of the History of Western Civilization (3 cr – also fills Historical/Cultural GenEd)
HIST 105, Colonial America to the Civil War (3 cr – also fills Social Justice GenEd)
Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total approximately 15 credits

Spring:

ENGL 114, College Writing II (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd)
HIST 102, The Making of the Modern World (3 cr)
HIST 106, The Civil War to Modern America (3 cr)
Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total 30 credits for the year

Fall or Spring:

HLTH 100, Wellness: A Way of Life (3 cr – fills Health and Wellness GenEd)

HIST Major – Typical Second-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your second year. You should select major requirements from the flexible timing section, GenEds, or electives to total 30 credits for the year.

HIST Major – Typical Third-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your third year. You should select major requirements from the flexible timing section, GenEds, or electives to total 30 credits for the year.

HIST Major – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

HIST 482, History Seminar (3 cr – also fills half of WAC GenEd)
Plus any outstanding major requirements, GenEds, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

Additional HIST Requirements – Flexible Timing

In general, 200-level courses can be taken first year or later, and 300-level can be taken second year or later. As courses may not be offered every year, 400-level courses should be taken third year if offered.

Select **6 credits** from the following American history courses:

- HIST 150, Leadership in U.S. History: The White House (3 cr)
- HIST 201, Making History Public (3 cr)
- HIST 210, African American History (3 cr)
- HIST 260, The Civil War Era in History and Memory (3 cr)
- HIST 310, American Immigration History (3 cr)
- HIST 360, Early American Thought and Culture (3 cr)
- HIST 361, Modern American Thought and Culture (3 cr)
- HIST 365, Environmental History of America (3 cr)
- HIST 387, Studies in History (America in the World) (3 cr)
- HIST 388, Studies in History (American) (3 cr)
- HIST 481, Recent American History (3 cr)

Select **6 credits** from the following non-American history courses:

- HIST 223, History of Russia (3 cr)
- HIST 325, The Ancient and Classical World (3 cr)
- HIST 326, Medieval History (3 cr)
- HIST 327, Early Modern Europe (3 cr)
- HIST 335, Modern China (3 cr)
- HIST 387, Studies in History (America in the World) (3 cr)
- HIST 389, Studies in History (non-American) (3 cr)
- HIST 405, The History of the Soviet Union (3 cr)
- HIST 450, Europe Since 1900 (3 cr)

Select **9 additional credits** of HIST electives (excluding HIST 441)

HIST Program Standards

Program standards for the HIST major include, but are not limited to:

- Earn a minimum of 2.500 for all courses required for the HIST major

GenEd Requirements and Electives

This major typically takes 36 credits to complete. In addition to the requirements previously listed, you must complete:

- **Additional GenEds:** 2nd half of WAC, Computer Applications, Literary Studies, Visual/Performing Arts, Spiritual/Ethical Dimensions, Quantitative Reasoning, Natural Sciences, Behavioral/Social Sciences, International/Multicultural Studies, and Physical Activity
- **44 elective credits or more** (depending on GenEds selected) to total 120 credits
- The **residency requirement**—60 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)
