
# Phi Theta Kappa 2021 Transfer Honor Roll

For the sixth-consecutive year, Springfield College was named to the Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Transfer Honor Roll, which identifies the top four-year colleges and universities that create dynamic pathways to support transfers from community colleges. Springfield College is one of only 150 colleges and universities in the country to be recognized for this honor.



All Phi Theta Kappa members are eligible for our highest-tier merit and a \$3,500 PTK scholarship, totaling \$28,500, which represents a significant portion of the comprehensive fee.

Springfield College is once again ranked in the Top Tier in the category of "Best Regional Universities —North Region" by *U.S. News & World Report* in its 2022 Best Colleges report. The College is ranked no. 27, marking the seventh-consecutive year Springfield College is ranked in the top 30 in its category. The College also is ranked 16th in its category of the *U.S. News* Best Value rankings that showcase colleges with high quality and a lower cost.

# Transferring Credits

After acceptance, we provide each student with a transfer credit evaluation that explains how your credits are accepted.

Generally, credits from courses taken at regionally accredited institutions that are 100-level or higher in which students earned a grade of C- or better will be accepted. These can be applied toward major, general education, or elective requirements.

Students who have earned an associate's degree within the last 10 years from a regionally accredited institution are eligible to have their general education requirements waived.

Springfield College is a transfer-friendly institution and is committed to ensuring that students progress toward their degree in a timely fashion. As a result, we will accept Pass, Credit, and Satisfactory grades for the semesters disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic. For majors requiring a specific letter grade or GPA requirement, courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis for direct equivalency of major requirements. If the direct equivalency to a major requirement can not be established, students will be awarded elective credit.

# **Applying to Springfield College**

Visit springfield.edu/transferapplication to start the process. To apply, you must submit the following:

- Either our online application form, the Common Application, or our paper application
- Personal essay: Please provide a statement that addresses your reasons for transferring and the objectives you hope to achieve.
- Official final high school and college transcripts (transcripts from each school attended are required)
- Letter of recommendation
- Completed Transfer College Report from each college attended

Some programs have additional requirements.

- Fall preferred application deadline: July 1
- Fall final deadline: Aug. 15
- Spring preferred application deadline: Dec. 1
- Spring final deadline: Jan. 5
- Physical therapy (fall enrollment only): Dec. 1
- Occupational therapy and physician assistant (fall enrollment only): Jan. 15

# **MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS**

Awards are determined based on your cumulative college GPA.

Distinguished scholarship: \$25,000 annually, eligibility: GPA 3.5 or higher

Honors scholarship: \$22,000 annually, eligibility: GPA 3.2 - 3.49

Achiever's scholarship: \$20,000 annually, eligibility: GPA 3.0 - 3.19

For those students with a cumulative college GPA less than a 3.0, we are pleased to offer the Director Award: \$15,000 annually.
