Careers in Community Youth Development and Leadership

The Bachelor of Science in Recreation Management with a concentration in community youth development and leadership prepares you for positions and careers in:

Create Your Own Flexible Schedule

We offer you Bachelor of Science in Recreation Management course delivery options so that you can build a schedule that works around your busy life. Choose a fully online program or a hybrid program, which includes a mix of online courses and hybrid courses with both face-to-face and online hours. Whichever you choose, we are prepared to support you. Please note that all concentration courses are delivered online.

Hybrid Weekend Courses

These classes take place Saturdays and Sundays (typically twice per month) and feature additional online coursework.

Fully Online Courses

All coursework is completed online in a social and interactive learning environment.

Community Youth Development and Leadership Concentration Curriculum

Required Courses

(12 credits)

- Adolescent Development in Context
- Alternative Theories in Youth Development
- Transformative Cross-Culture Youth Leadership
- Building Competencies in Community Youth Work

Sample Elective Courses

(12 credits)

- Grant Writing and Fundraising
- Introduction to Community Organizing
- Volunteerism and Human Services
- Cross-Cultural Perspectives in Social Services
- Human Growth and Development
- Family Counseling
- Violence and Social Control

To graduate, you will need 120 credits, 45 of which must be completed at Springfield College. In order to earn a Bachelor of Science in Recreation Management with the community youth development and leadership concentration, you must take the 24 required concentration and major credits, plus an additional 12 elective credits. Students may take the required and elective courses at Springfield College, or transfer in courses from other regionally accredited higher education institutions. Credits also may be awarded through the experiential learning process.

Practical Experience in Community Youth Agencies

An internship in a youth services organization is the culmination of your recreation management program. The internship is designed to aid students in developing practical knowledge in a youth service agency by shadowing and learning from more experienced professionals. Ultimately, an internship in a community youth agency will grow your resume, enhance your understanding of current issues, help you gain valuable work experience, and grow your professional network. Our internship requirements are flexible and designed for working students. Internships may be completed over multiple semesters, and students with industry related experience may use this towards their internship requirement.
