Undeclared Major – Typical First-Year Schedule	
Fall: ENGL 113, College Writing I (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd) SPCO 110, First-Year Seminar: Building Community and Success (3 cr) Plus transportable GenEds or major exploratory courses to total 14 to 16 credits	Spring: ENGL 114, College Writing II (3 cr – fills half College Writing GenEd) Plus transportable GenEds or major exploratory courses to total approximately 30 credits for the year
<p style="text-align: center;">Transportable GenEds, recommended for Fall or Spring:</p> CISC 105, Introduction to Computer Concepts, or CISC 115, Microcomputer Applications (3 cr – fills Computing/Technology GenEd) HIST 105, 106, 102, or 101 (3 cr – fills History GenEd) HLTH 100, Wellness: A Way of Life, or HLTH 101, Physical Health and Wellness (3 cr – fills Health and Wellness GenEd) Intermediate level language, if appropriate
