

Manchester Community College Associate's Degree to Springfield College Bachelor of Science in Sociology

After earning your Associate's degree, you will be responsible for completing a maximum of 33 credits of sociology major requirements, any additional elective credits to reach 120, and fulfilling the College's residency requirement of 45 credits, including 15 of your last 30. Springfield College waives all general education requirements, with the exception of those that are major requirements, due to earning an associate's degree and accepts a maximum of 75 transfer credits.

Plus any electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career and fulfill the College's residency requirement of 45 credits, including 15 of your last 30.

Any SOCL major may add the Social Work concentration. It is highly recommended for those interested in the 5-year combined BS/MSW program.
