GRANTS AND SPONSORED RESEARCH

Officials from the Springfield Public School district have renewed a memorandum of understanding to award \$100,000 in fiscal 2019 to Springfield College for “Supporting development of effective educators,” directed by **Linda Davis-Delano**, EdD, director of educator preparation and licensure. Funding will support Springfield College tuition for teachers and paraprofessionals enrolled in the College S-Cubed master’s degree program. S-Cubed was initiated in fiscal 2013 with a grant from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to prepare in-service Springfield Public School teachers in high-need schools for their state initial licensure in high-need subjects such as math and science, and to teach students with moderate disabilities. Upon S-Cubed completion, teachers may finish their master’s degree at Springfield College at a reduced program tuition rate.

Officials of Campus Compact of Southern New England have awarded a new AmeriCorps Volunteers in Service

to America volunteer position to Springfield College to serve in fiscal 2019. The full-time volunteer will report to **Charlene Elvers**, director of the Center for Leadership and Service.

Springfield College has received a \$4,000 Campus Innovation Grant from the Interfaith Youth Core in Chicago for fiscal 2019 due to the efforts of **Katherine Dugan**, PhD, assistant professor of religion, who proposed the project, “Building a culture of interfaith engagement” to develop an interfaith club on campus. Dugan will be assisted by **David McMahon**, director of the Office of Spiritual Life.

City of Springfield officials have awarded Springfield College a \$4,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the Pride Literacy Awards Program for the 2018-19 school year. In 2000, **Charlie Brock**, MEd, head coach of the men’s basketball team, designed the award-winning community-service program through which team members volunteer their time reading to and inspiring elementary students in the Springfield Public Schools. Annual CDBG funding over the years has enabled Brock and his student-athletes to serve every elementary school in the city.

Officials of Five Colleges, Inc., on behalf of the Five College Schools Partnership, awarded \$4,000 and travel expenses to Springfield College as part of the Pathways for Diverse Paraprofessionals initiative of the Diverse Teacher Workforce Coalition of Western Massachusetts. **Linda Davis-Delano**, PhD, director of educator preparation and licensure, will serve as a co-leader for the paraprofessional support team, which includes the Springfield College Step Up Paras Program, also directed by Davis-Delano. **Stephanie Logan**, EdD, chair of the Department of Education, will co-lead the Culture Change Team. **Linda L. Marston**, PhD, director of grants and sponsored research, serves on the leadership for the Diverse Teacher Workforce Coalition and a co-leader for the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion working group of the coalition.

For the fifth-consecutive year, the Association for Officials of Applied Sport Psychology have awarded a \$500 grant to support the graduate student-led 2019 Association for Applied Sport Psychology Regional Conference at Springfield College. The conference will be directed again this spring by **Taylor McCavanagh**, MS, CMPC, a third-year doctoral candidate in counseling psychology with a concentration in athletic counseling.
